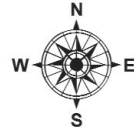


Campground Map

Park entrance gates are open from 7am - 10pm.

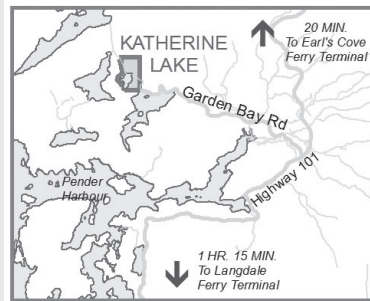

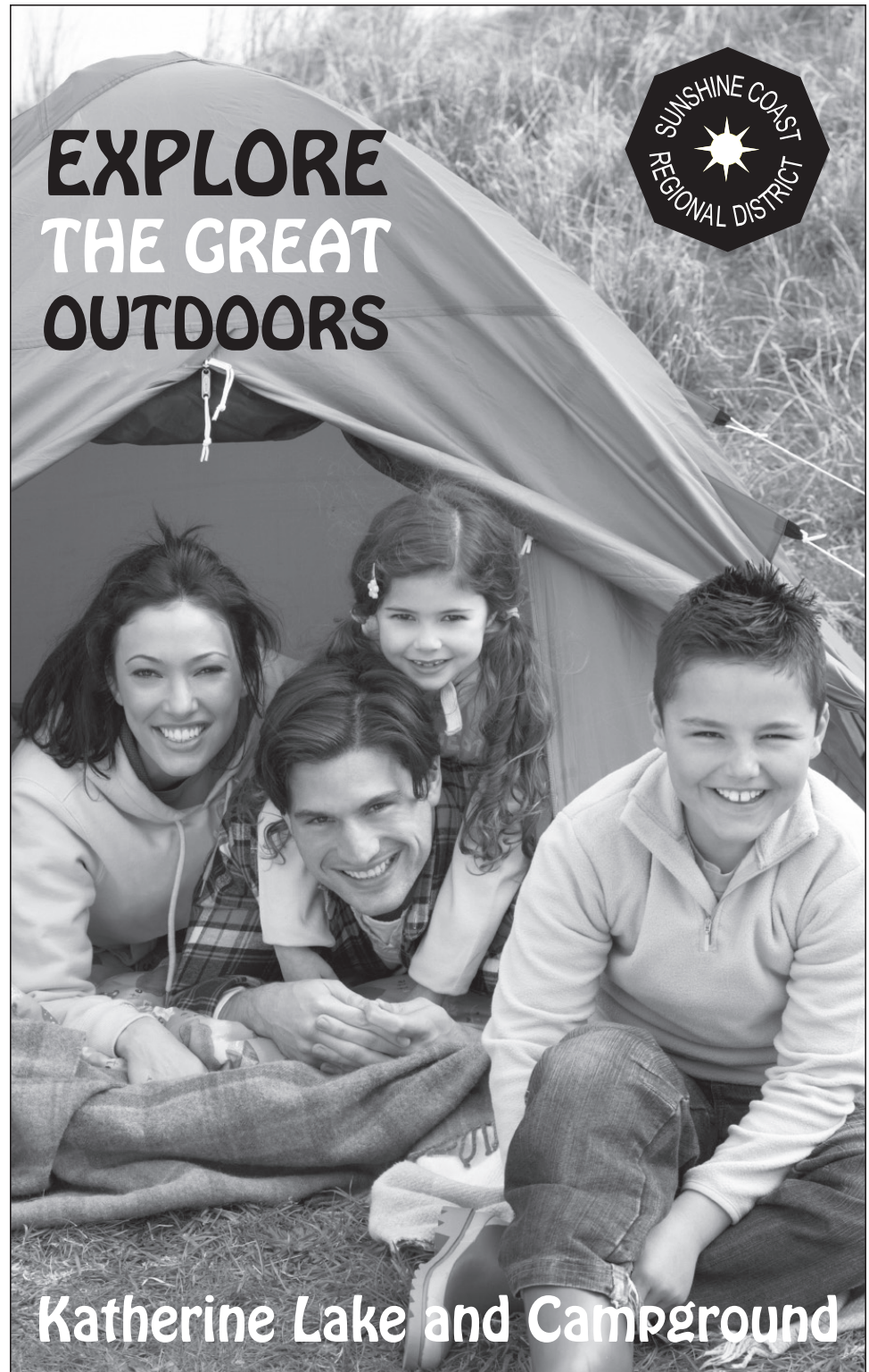

Katherine Lake and Campground

CAMPING WITH YOUR FAMILY HAS NEVER BEEN EASIER

In April of 1990, with the help of a grant from GoBC, the Sunshine Coast Regional District purchased approximately 37 hectares of land which surrounds the fresh water lake known as Katherine Lake.



The acquired parkland has been an asset to the entire Sunshine Coast providing a prime public recreation resource. This picturesque lake is a popular swimming spot to enjoy for a day, or as part of a camping trip.

Amenities

Katherine Lake Park has sites for 19 recreational vehicles with RV hookups, and ten tent campsites. The park has two washroom facilities with showers, sandy swimming beach, small playground, fishing, boating, onsite caretaker, and a day use picnic area. Note: There is no sanitation flush facility.

Dogs

Dogs must be leashed and are not allowed on the beach or in the swimming area.



Turtle Conservation

Katherine Lake is home to an endangered Western Painted Turtle population. Please do not interfere with the turtles and their habitat.

Camping

Camping season runs from the May long weekend to the October long weekend. A person or group under the age of 18 must be accompanied by a legal guardian or parent. Campground information is available at the park entrance and from the caretaker.

Garbage

Please use designated garbage receptacles. Holding tanks should be emptied at sanitation facilities which can be found at most Provincial Park campsite locations.

Campfires

Campfires should not be lit during strong winds and must be attended and kept small at all times. Please extinguish your campfire before leaving and do not cut trees or remove firewood.



Drive Cautiously

Roads are often used by visitors as paths and play areas, so please respect the maximum speed limit of 15 km/hour. Do not drive over the vegetation.

Parking

Parking is available in designated areas. Keep roads clear, do not block traffic.

Vehicle Policy

There is a maximum of one vehicle per party, unless the vehicle is towed or is a commuter vehicle. All other vehicles require payment of an additional camping pass. Vehicles and ATVs must be kept on roads, parking areas and campsites.

Procedures and Reservations

Please check availability at the attendant's site. A camping permit is required for overnight use of this facility and fees will be collected by an attendant at your campsite. Fees are used to provide maintenance and supervision at this site. Reservations can be made by calling 604-883-9557. Check-in time is noon, check-out time is 11:00 a.m..

Rates

Daily fees are \$18 per party, and \$22 for an RV. There is a maximum of six people per campsite unless you are a family. Fees are payable in advance. The main gate opens at 7:00 a.m. and closes at 10:00 p.m. with no special requests.

Other

Hunting or firearms are not allowed in the park. Gas powered boats are not permitted on the lake.

Courtesy

Please respect the peace and quiet of others. Keep your noise to a minimum at all times. Designated quiet time is from 11:00 p.m. to 7:00 a.m.
