### Second Order Issued Under State of Local Emergency

Sechelt, BC—November 10, 2022— A second order has been issued under the State of Local Emergency (SOLE) that is currently in place on the Sunshine Coast.

This order [linked here](#) is necessary as we look to secure water supply into the coming months and affects a non-commercial use of water which include:

- Private swimming pools and hot tubs
- Non-medical cannabis production
- Businesses that involve the transport, processing, cleaning, installation or repair of concrete, cement, asphalt, gravel, or aggregate
- Installation and maintenance of ice at the Sunshine Coast Arena

The District of Sechelt and the shíshálh Nation Government District have also issued similar orders.

If your business involves any of the above, you are asked to review the order. You must cease use of treated drinking water from the Chapman Water System by Friday, November 11 at 11:59 p.m.

“This is another step we need to take to secure water for essential use,” says Emergency Operations Centre (EOC) Director Remko Rosenboom. “I want to caution the business community that more orders may be required in the coming weeks due to how precarious the water supply situation may become.”
