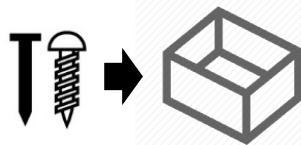
## SPECIAL NOTICE FOR 2020: DUE TO THE CURRENT PANDEMIC RESIDENTS WILL BE REQUIRED TO ADHERE TO THE FOLLOWING FOR THE SAFETY OF RESIDENTS AND STAFF

1. Pre-register for a flag stop
2. Prepare your dock as outlined below; be at your dock when barge arrives
3. Prepare items as outlined below
4. Prepare special items as outlined in companion documents  
Mark propane fridges .  
Ensure units containing Freon have doors and are emptied.  
Mattresses must be wrapped in clear plastic.
5. Adhere to the limit of 1 cubic metre per household (1 fridge, or 2 mattresses per household limit)
6. Adhere to physical distancing requirements of BC Public Health Officer  
Staff will load materials on to the barge and residents will be required to maintain a safe physical distance of 2m/6feet.

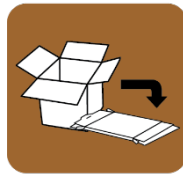
**NOTE:** Propane fridges require pre-registration



Household Garbage: Must be in clear garbage bags or will not be accepted



Place loose nails & screws in a container



Flatten cardboard boxes for recycling



Glass Bottles & Jars



For safe disposal, all glass items must be contained (e.g. box). Pane glass must be removed from the frame.



If possible, please move boats out of the way so that barge can access your dock

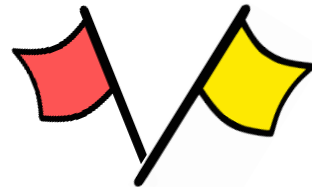
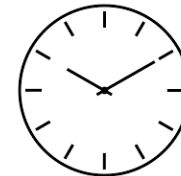


Resident must be at dock when barge arrives and maintain physical distancing

Place bright flag or personal flotation device (PFD) at your dock to be visible by barge operator



# 2020 SUNSHINE COAST ISLANDS CLEAN UP – ACCEPTED ITEMS

**SPECIAL NOTICE FOR 2020:** Due to the current pandemic there are a few minor changes to the program to ensure the safety of residents and staff. More details will be available at [www.scrd.ca/islands-cleanup](http://www.scrd.ca/islands-cleanup). Some of these changes include:

- Staff will adhere to physical distancing requirements as per BC Public Health Officer
- Residents are asked to follow BC Public Health Officer recommendations
- Residents should be prepared to load their material without staff assistance
- Please do not bring more people than necessary
- Maximum amount per household to be strictly adhered to

## MATERIALS COLLECTED & PREPARATION REQUIRED

**Maximum Load Size – 1 cubic meter per household** (size of 2 washing machines).

Remove all batteries from items, tape battery terminals and place in designated bucket.

Nails/screws pose a hazard and should be placed in designated bucket.

### Metal - 98% metal

- Misc. scrap metal (e.g. lawn furniture, bed frames, barbecues, pipes, non-freon appliances, misc. metal)
- Lawnmowers, trimmers etc. - must have gas and oil removed
- Prawn and crab traps

### General Garbage

- Durable goods (e.g. stuffed chairs, sofa)
- Misc. garbage - if bagged, must be in clear plastic bags or will not be accepted

### Glass – Place in garbage with due care to ensure safe handling

- Pane glass - must be removed from frame, broken into pieces and placed in cardboard box
- Glass bottles, jars (broken and unbroken)

### Household Recyclables

- Cardboard – *please flatten to maximize space in bin*

## SPECIAL ITEMS

### **1. Items Containing Freon - To be loaded separately – Max 1 fridge/freezer per household**

- Fridges (incl propane fridge), freezers, air conditioners, water coolers
- *Registration required for flag stops*
- *Propane fridges require pre-registration*

***Residential versions only of Items Containing Freon. No commercial units.***

### **2. Mattresses -To be loaded separately – Max 2 mattresses, or 1 mattress and 1 fridge/freezer**

- Must be wrapped in clear plastic (several bags taped together will be accepted)
- Free of bed bugs

### **3. Tarps, rope, nets, sheet plastic, hoses, carpet – contributes to household maximum.**

- Must be cut into 1m/4ft sections and bagged in clear bags (can be mixed with general garbage)

## MATERIALS NOT COLLECTED

- Boats (e.g. canoes, kayaks, skiffs)
- Construction and demolition waste (e.g. wood, roofing shingles, gypsum, vinyl flooring, vermiculite insulation)
- Glass still in frames (e.g. windows, doors)
- Household hazardous waste (e.g. cleaners, pesticides, flammables, flares, oily rags, gas, oil, fireworks)
- Items longer than 12ft
- Organics (e.g. food waste, yard and garden green waste)
- Wood furniture (e.g. book cases, shelving, chairs, desks)

- Paint Products

### FRIDGE AND FREEZER RECYCLING

**HOUSEHOLD LIMIT: 1 fridge or 1 freezer**

**Note: If the household is recycling one fridge or freezer they may recycle 1 mattress or box spring.**

#### Products **ACCEPTED**

- Fridges
- Propane Fridges
- Bar Fridges
- Stand up Freezers
- Chest Freezers
- Air Conditioning Units

#### Products **NOT ACCEPTED**

- Unemptied freezers
- Propane tanks still attached
- Unmarked propane fridges

#### Preparation Requirements

The following preparation is required to ensure the recyclability of units containing refrigerant.

If proper preparations are not taken your fridge or freezer will not be accepted.

- Empty all fridges and freezers
- Mark propane fridge with a "P" or stripe with spray paint or permanent marker on all sides

### MATTRESS RECYCLING

#### **HOUSEHOLD LIMIT: 2 MATTRESSES OR 1 MATTRESS & 1 BOXSPRING**

**Note: Residents can recycle 1 mattress or 1 boxspring with 1 fridge or freezer**

#### **Products ACCEPTED**

- Mattresses made with coils
- Mattresses made of foam
- Mattresses of all sizes
- Crib mattresses
- Box springs
- Futons made of foam
- Adjustable and electronic

#### **Products NOT ACCEPTED**

- Mattresses infested with bedbugs
- Mattresses that are not wrapped in clear plastics
- Mattresses covered in non-see-through plastic
- Mouldy or wet Futons – **place in garbage** not in mattress bin
- Air mattresses
- Bedding(e.g. sheets, covers, comforters, blankets and pillows) – donate or garbage
- Water beds

#### **Preparation Requirements**

**The following preparation is required to ensure the recyclability of mattresses and box springs.**

**If proper preparations are not taken your mattress will not be accepted.**

- Each unit must be wrapped/contained in clear plastic (e.g. moving bag, several bags taped together, pallet wrap, wrapping from a new mattress)
- Free of bed bugs
