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AND THAT the Corporate Officer be authorized to file a Notice at the Land Title Office stating that a resolution has been made by the Sunshine Coast Regional District Board under Section 57 of the *Community Charter* against the land title of Lot 9, District Lot 1388, Plan 13161, PID 008-723-796;

AND FURTHER THAT the Corporate Officer be authorized to file a Notice at the Land Title Office stating that a resolution has been made by the Sunshine Coast Regional District Board under Section 57 of the *Community Charter* against the land title of Lot C, District Lot 3960, Plan EPP9926, PID 028-686-861.

BACKGROUND

Section 57(1) of the *Community Charter* allows a building official to recommend that a notice be registered against the land title where a building official observes a condition with respect to land, building or other structure that is considered to contravene a Regional District Bylaw, Provincial regulation or any other enactment that relates to the construction or safety of buildings or other structures.

This report lists properties where a building or other structure is considered to be unsafe or is unlikely to be usable for its expected purpose, or where something was constructed that required a permit or inspections under a bylaw, regulation or enactment which have not been obtained or completed to the satisfaction of the building division.

Letters have been sent advising the registered owners that certain specific conditions exist regarding their property and requesting that building permits be obtained and completed in an effort to achieve voluntary compliance.

The *Community Charter* requires that the Regional District Board must pass a resolution to place a Notice on Title. The Corporate Officer has sent registered letters to all of the registered owners of the properties listed in this report. The owners have been advised of the date and

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time of the Board meeting at which the decision to register a Notice on Title will be made, and that at this meeting they will be afforded the opportunity to speak to the issues being registered.

DISCUSSION

The properties listed are non-compliant due to one or more of the following:

- Permits applied for / or issued but not all required inspections have been approved.
- Construction has taken place without a valid permit.
- 1. 13117 Claydon Lane, Lot 4, District Lot 2226, Plan 7889, Group 1, NWD PID 005-152-623 Electoral Area A

A building permit was issued 16 October 2015 for the reconstruction of a deck. The permit has expired without final inspection approval. The SCRD Building Division is not aware of any life safety issues at this time and recommend notice be placed on title.

2. Trail Island, Lot 9, District Lot 1388, Plan 13161, Group 1, NWD PID 008-723-796 Electoral Area B

Construction of a Single Family Dwelling was started without a valid building permit. A permit was issued 14 October 2011, was renewed twice and has expired without final inspection approval. The SCRD Building Division is not aware of any life safety issues at this time and recommend notice be placed on title.

3. 13346 Sunshine Coast Highway, Lot C, District Lot 3960, Plan EPP9926, Group 1, NWD PID 028-686-861 Electoral Area A

Building Permit 12294 was issued 13 December 2011 to complete the construction of an addition to a Single Family Dwelling started under Permit 8855, which expired. Permit 12294 has now expired without final inspection approval. The SCRD Building Division is not aware of any life safety issues at this time and recommend notice be placed on title.

Sunshine Coast Regional District

Bylaw No. 714

A bylaw to provide for the imposition of a charge against the owners of land or real property for the use and operation of the sewage treatment facility established by *Sakinaw Ridge Community Sewage Treatment System Service Establishing Bylaw No. 1087, 2017* and amendments thereto.

The Board of the Sunshine Coast Regional District in open meeting assembled enacts as follows:

1. Citation

This bylaw may be cited as the Sakinaw Ridge Community Sewage Treatment System Fees and Charges Bylaw No. 714, 2018.

2. Interpretation

"Board" means the elected Board of the Sunshine Coast Regional District.

"**Engineer**" means the person holding the office of General Manager, Infrastructure Services for the Regional District, or a duly authorized representative.

"Frontage Charge" means a tax levied in each year on each parcel of land capable of being connected to a sewage treatment facility.

"**Owner**" means a person or company who has title to the land or building and includes a person or company whose name appears on the assessment roll.

"**Person**" includes any corporation, partnership or party and heirs, executors, administrators, or other legal representatives of such person, to whom the context can apply according to law.

"**Regional District**" means the Sunshine Coast Regional District or persons duly authorized to represent the Sunshine Coast Regional District in respect to this Bylaw.

"Regional District Infrastructure Services Department" means the department of the Regional District responsible for the sewage collection and disposal.

"**Residential or Apartment unit**" means one or more rooms constituting a unit of living accommodation used or intended to be used for living and sleeping purposes and which contains a kitchen and washroom facilities.

"Sewer Service Connection" means a 50mm (2") connection or larger to a sewer main for the purpose of sewage disposal and is the property of the Regional District.

"User Charge" means a charge levied in each year on each residential or apartment unit connected to a sewage treatment facility.

3. Condition for the Installation of Services

- 3.1 All applications for the installation of a sewer service connection must be made to the Regional District Infrastructure Services Department by the owner or his authorized agent, who must, at the time of such application, execute an agreement with the Regional District.
- 3.2 When an application is approved, the owner or his agent will pay to the Regional District the connection fee established by Schedule "A" attached to this bylaw and when the fee has been paid, a sewer service connection will be provided to within 450mm of the street line and/or boundary line, when the service can be conveniently installed.
- 3.3 Installation of services will only be made by the Regional District Infrastructure Services Department or under the direct supervision of the Engineer.

4. Inspection of Premises by Engineer

4.1 Every person having a sewer connection under this Bylaw will, at all reasonable times, allow the Engineer, or any person authorized by the Engineer for such purpose (either generally or in any particular instance) to enter into and upon the premises for the purpose of inspecting such sewer connection.

5. Rates or Charges

- 5.1 There is hereby imposed and levied a sewer user charge against the owners of land or real property whose property is connected to the sewage treatment facility and the Regional District will classify each consumer in accordance with the categories set out in Schedule "A", attached to this Bylaw.
- 5.2 There is hereby imposed and levied a sewer frontage charge against the owners of land or real property whose property is capable of being connected to the sewage treatment facility and the Regional District will classify each consumer in accordance with the categories set out in Schedule "A", attached to this Bylaw.
- 5.3 The general rates or charges payable under Schedule "A" as applicable will be due and payable on June 15th of the billing year. If June 15th falls on a Saturday, Sunday or Statutory Holiday the due date will become the first business day immediately following June 15th for that year. If not paid by the due date a non-compounding 2% monthly interest charge will be imposed upon the unpaid balance.
- 5.4 The following conditions apply to the general rates or charges payable:
 - (a) non-receipt of the utility bill will not be recognized as a valid reason for failure to pay the fees when due;
 - (b) postmarks will not be considered as date of payment;
 - (c) all payments received will be applied firstly against arrears, then to current balances;

- (d) interest is imposed on outstanding account balances in excess of \$10.00.
- 5.5 In the case of a connection being made during the year, the sewer user charge will be imposed from the first of the month following the date of connection, and will be prorated on the basis of the charges in accordance with Schedule "A" of this Bylaw and will be paid in advance for the remainder of the year.
- 5.6 Where multiple independent users exist on what is commonly referred to as a Common Connection Line, the individual rates as defined in Schedule "A" of this Bylaw will be applicable whether or not an independent sewer line has been installed for individual users.
- 5.6 No levy will be made for sewer usage in respect to any vacant or unoccupied premises, but no premises will be deemed vacant or unoccupied unless notice in writing has been delivered to the Regional District, or unless water service to the premises has been disconnected.
- 5.8 Any rate remaining unpaid on the thirty-first (31) day of December will be deemed to be taxes in arrears and will be recovered in the manner provided in the *Local Government Act.*

6. Application of Bylaw

The provisions of this Bylaw are applicable to and binding upon all persons serviced or serviceable by the Regional District whether such persons have made written application or not.

7. Schedules

Schedule "A" attached hereto is included in and forms part of this Bylaw.

8. General

If any section, subsection or clause of this Bylaw is for any reason held to be invalid by the decision of a court of competent jurisdiction, such decision will not affect the validity of the remaining portions of this Bylaw.

PART A – CITATION

1. This bylaw may be cited as the Sunshine Coast Regional District Zoning Amendment Bylaw No. 310.173, 2017.

PART B – AMENDMENT

- 2. Sunshine Coast Regional District Zoning Bylaw No. 310, 1987 is hereby amended as follows:
 - a. In Section 301 (1) add "M1 Marine Transportation" following "C5 Commercial Five";
 - b. In Section 502 (14), Business Signs in Non-Commercial/Industrial Zones, add ", M1" in the list of zones after "C6";
 - c. In Section 502 (15), Business Signs in Commercial and Industrial Zones, add ", M1" in the list of zones after "C6";
 - d. In Part VIII (Commercial Zones), insert the following in numerical order as follows:

"851 M1 Zone (Marine Transportation)

851 On a parcel in an M1 Zone.

Permitted Uses

- 851.1 except as otherwise permitted in Part V of this bylaw the following and no other uses are permitted:
 - marine transportation including the temporary storage of marine vessels (private and/or public);
 - (2) transportation centre including foot passengers, bicyclists, transit, car share, commercial trailer drop, float plane and emergency helicopter services;

- (3) auxiliary to (1) and (2):
 - (a) office;
 - (b) retail;
 - (c) restaurant;
 - (d) mobile vendors, including food trucks;
 - (e) one dwelling for the purpose of housing a caretaker or watchman;
 - (f) surface parking for employees, short and long term public parking;
 - (g) park.

Conditions of Use

851.2 the combined floor area and site area for retail, restaurant and mobile vendor uses shall not exceed 20% of the total building floor area up to a maximum of 835 square metres;

Siting of Structures

- 851.3 no structure shall be located within:
 - (a) 7.5 metres of the front parcel line;
 - (b) 4.5 metres of a side parcel setback;

Height of Buildings and Structures

- 851.4 (a) buildings shall not exceed 20 metres;
 - (b) structures shall not exceed 25 metres;
 - (c) fences within the setback area may not exceed 3 metres;

Parcel Coverage

851.5 the maximum parcel coverage of all buildings and structures shall not exceed 50%;

Buildings Per Parcel

- 851.6 subject to compliance with all other provisions of this bylaw more than one building may be permitted."

BYLAW NO. 600.5, 2017

A bylaw to amend the Elphinstone Official Community Plan Bylaw No. 600, 2007

The Board of Directors of the Sunshine Coast Regional District, in open meeting assembled, enacts as follows:

PART A – CITATION

1. This bylaw may be cited as the *Elphinstone Official Community Plan Amendment Bylaw No. 600.5, 2017.*

PART B – AMENDMENT

2. *Elphinstone Official Community Plan Bylaw No. 600, 2007* is hereby amended as follows:

i. Replace sub-section 2 of Section "B-10.5 Ocean Beach Esplanade Policies" with the following sub-sections:

- 2. Restoration or rebuilding of existing structures, or features including but not limited to parking pads, driveways, decks, patios, retaining walls and landscaping that are encroaching onto the public right-of-way is permitted only if a road closure or an encroachment or setback permit has been granted by the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure and it can be determined through a development permit that there are no other feasible locations on the property for these structures or features, and the redevelopment can be safely carried out without negative impact on the function, safety, use and appearance of the adjacent public space.
- 3. The following guidelines shall be used to guide the Regional District's response to referrals by the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure concerning road closure and encroachment and setback permit applications to facilitate redevelopment of structures or features encroaching onto the Ocean Beach Esplanade. However, it is recognized that the final decision on these applications rests solely with the Ministry of Transportation and Infrastructure.
 - (a) Road closure should be considered for the encroaching principal dwellings only. Encroachment or setback permits may be considered for auxiliary structures and other features, including but not limited to parking pads, driveways, decks, patios, retaining walls and landscape features.
 - (b) Wherever possible, the redevelopment of an existing structure or feature should incorporate parts of the parent parcel and be designed to minimize the area necessary for road closure or encroachment on the road right-of-way.

- (c) The area proposed for road closure should be limited to the footprint of the existing principal dwelling plus a 1-metre buffer around the footprint.
- 4. The following guidelines shall be used in evaluating development permit applications for structures or features encroaching onto the Ocean Beach Esplanade.
 - (a) Restoration or rebuilding of existing structures or features should be limited to the original footprint and height.
 - (b) The redevelopment should help to enhance the safety of all users of the Esplanade (including motorists, cyclists and pedestrians). Design of buildings and landscape features should consider proper vehicle turning radius and driveway visibility and slope and limit private parking on the road right-of-way.
 - (c) Architectural and/or landscaping design plans should accompany the development permit application illustrating how the development can fit into the surrounding environment, and complement the private and public space along the Esplanade.
 - (d) Geotechnical and environmental reports prepared by qualified professionals must be submitted with the development permit application confirming that the redevelopment is safe from landslide, erosion and flood hazards, and has no negative impact on the drainage and natural environment in the surrounding areas and technical functions and safety of the adjacent public right-of-way.
 - (e) The geotechnical reports must consider the impacts of major earthquakes on the subject properties and adjacent road right-of-way and provide recommendations on damage mitigation and risk prevention measures. The environmental reports must consider future sea level rise and its potential impacts on the subject properties and adjacent road right-of-way and provide recommendations on damage mitigation and risk prevention measures.
