STRATEGIC PLAN AND RELATED POLICIES

SUBJECT: FINANCIAL CLOSEOUT OF THE CHAPMAN LAKE WATER SUPPLY EXPANSION PROJECT

RECOMMENDATION(S)

THAT the report titled Implications of the Financial Closeout of the Chapman Lake Supply Expansion Project be received;

AND THAT a bylaw to repeal Chapman Lake Water Supply Expansion Loan Authorization Bylaw No. 704 be prepared;

AND THAT project expenditures for consulting services totaling \$374,061 be funded from Regional Water Service operating reserves.

BACKGROUND

On February 7, 2019 the SCRD received a letter from the Honorable Minster of Environment and Climate Change Strategies, George Heyman, denying the park boundary amendment for Tetrahedron Provincial Park that was required in order or the Chapman Lake Water Supply Expansion Project to proceed. Staff provided a report to the April 18, 2019 Infrastructure Services Committee, however, direction on financial treatment of the project was not concluded.

As a result, the following disclosure was included in the Notes to the Financial Statements for the Year Ended December 31, 2018:

25. Subsequent Event

On February 7, 2019, the Minister of Environment and Climate Change Strategy denied the Regional District's request to amend the boundaries of a provincial park, which had been made for the purpose of the Chapman Lake Water Supply Expansion Project. As at December 31, 2018, \$392,119 is included in Work in Progress in relation to this project.

Management is currently analyzing the implications and options remaining to the Regional District. The Board will make a decision on the status of the project. If the project does not move forward, there will be an impact on approved debt, tangible capital assets and the fund balances.

The project was included as a carry forward in the 2019-2023 Financial Plan and an additional \$14,327 in project related expenditures, consisting mainly of staff wages, were incurred in the first quarter of the 2019 fiscal year.

The project was not included as a carry forward in the 2020-2024 Financial Plan adopted on March 12, 2020. Final project expenditures totaled \$406,446.

The purpose of this report is to summarize and closeout any remaining financial considerations with respect to project funding, the 2019 Financial Statements and Loan authorization Bylaw No. 704.

DISCUSSION

Project funding

Budgeted funding for the project consisted of long-term borrowing with the exception of capitalized staff wages which are funded from parcel taxes. Capitalized wages totaled \$32,385 resulting in \$374,061 in expenditures for which the budgeted funding source was long-term borrowing.

Loan Authorization Bylaw No. 704 for the borrowing of up to \$5,000,000 was adopted on July 28, 2016 after received approval of the electors through an alternate approval process.

Prior to adoption of the Loan Authorization Bylaw, the Board adopted the following recommendation at its regular meeting on January 14, 2016:

Contract Award It was moved and seconded

021/16 THAT Chapman Lake Water Supply Expansion RFP 15 248 consulting services contract be awarded to AECOM with a value of \$503,490 including taxes, to be funded through Regional Water [370] reserves;

AND THAT the reserves be replenished once the project borrowing is complete;

AND FURTHER THAT the 2016 Financial Plan be amended accordingly.

Per the recommendation above, Regional Water reserves were utilized to temporarily fund the \$374,061 in expenditures for consulting services incurred up to receipt of the Minister's decision in February 2019.

Given that the borrowing for this project will not be completed, it is recommended that the Regional Water Service operating reserves be permanently drawn down to fund the \$374,061 in project expenditures for consulting services originally intended to be funded through long-term borrowing. This will reduce the uncommitted operating reserve balance from \$2,098,288 to \$1,724,227.

2019 Financial Statements

Based on the change to the project status in 2019, Public Sector Accounting Standards require that the balance of the project currently capitalized as work in process be charged to operations in the current period.

This will result in a decrease to the value of tangible capital assets and an increase to operating expenses of \$406,446 in 2019.

Loan Authorization Bylaw No. 704

As noted above, Loan Authorization Bylaw No. 704 for the borrowing of up to \$5,000,000 to fund the Chapman Lake Water Supply Expansion Project was adopted on July 28, 2016.

Despite the project being cancelled, the authorization remains in place for a period of five years from the date of adoption and the SCRD is required to disclose this in our financial statements and other statutory reporting to the Province.

As such, staff recommend preparing a bylaw to repeal Chapman Lake Water Supply Expansion Loan Authorization Bylaw No. 704.

Alternatively, the Bylaw can be left to expire on July 21, 2021.

As a result, the project has not been carried forward in the 2020-2024 Financial Plan. Final project expenditures totaled \$406,446 that were capitalized as work in process will be charged to operation expenses in 2019 based on Public Sector Accounting Standards.

Additionally, staff recommend that \$374,061 in project expenditures for consulting services that were intended to be funded from long-term borrowing be funded through operating reserves and that Loan Authorization Bylaw No. 704 be repealed.

Good morning,

On behalf of the Select Standing Committee on Finance and Government Services, I am writing to provide an important update with respect to the Committee's annual budget consultation.

As you may know, the Committee invites British Columbians to share their priorities and ideas for the next provincial budget during a public consultation. The Budget Transparency and Accountability Act requires the Minister of Finance to release a budget consultation paper, which is referred to the Committee, by September 15, and for the Committee to report on the results of the consultation with recommendations by November 15.

While this consultation has typically taken place in the fall, last year, the Committee held the consultation in the summer. Following a review of this change, the Committee will again be holding the budget consultation in the summer. Accordingly, the Minister of Finance is expected to release the budget consultation paper no later than June 1, with the consultation taking place during the month of June. The Committee is expected to issue its report by early August.

As in previous years, the Committee will be visiting communities across the province to meet with British Columbians, as well as providing opportunities to make written, audio and video submissions and complete an online survey. Further details about the consultation, including the public hearing schedule, registration and participation options, will be released later this spring.

Re: UBCM Resolutions Process

In response to member feedback, the UBCM Executive is undertaking a review of the resolutions process. This will include consultation with members at Area Association spring conferences, and a subsequent report to the membership at the 2020 Annual Convention. While the review progresses, the Executive has committed to exercise their existing authority more fully, and apply greater rigour to the screening and vetting of resolutions submitted to UBCM for 2020.

With the understanding that a resolutions process review is already underway, the Resolutions Committee of the UBCM Executive has identified measures that UBCM can implement in the immediate term to streamline the process and address the number and repetitiveness of resolutions. In 2020, the Committee will seek to:

- Identify more directly the resolutions that address issues of priority to the membership, and ensure that debate of these priority issues takes place early on.
- Be more firm in sending resolutions back to the sponsor if resolutions do not meet UBCM criteria for format, clear writing, factual information, or relevance to local government administration or operations.
- Standardize language to be gender neutral and, where applicable, refer to local governments or First Nations rather than municipalities or regional districts. The goal is to avoid using debate time to make such amendments.
- · Combine similar resolutions, without losing or changing their intent,
- Offer further education and support to members on writing clear, effective resolutions.
- Work more closely with Area Associations to improve the quality of resolutions debated at their spring conventions.

These streamlining measures could affect resolutions that your community submits to Area Associations or to UBCM this year.

Because complaints are confidential, we do not share complaint topic information if we received too few complaints to preserve the complainants' anonymity.
