SUBJECT: COVER AND AGGREGATE MATERIAL FOR SECHELT LANDFILL - CONTRACT AWARD

RECOMMENDATION(S)

(1) THAT the report titled Cover and Aggregate Material for Sechelt Landfill Contract Award be received for information;

- (2) AND THAT a contract be awarded to Salish Environmental Group Inc. for the supply and delivery of cover and aggregate material to the Sechelt Landfill up to a maximum of seven (7) years and a value of up to \$1,230,000 (excluding GST);
- (3) AND THAT the delegated authorities be authorized to execute the contract;
- (4) AND THAT the budget for cover and aggregate material for Sechelt landfill be increased by \$38,010 to \$151,200 funded through taxation;
- (5) AND FURTHER THAT the revised amounts be included in the Draft 2024-2028 Financial Plan.

BACKGROUND

The supply and delivery of cover and aggregate materials is a mandatory component of site operations at the Sechelt Landfill and is required on an ongoing basis to remain in compliance with the Ministry of Environment and Climate Change Strategy regulations. The use of cover material is required during day-to-day operations to bury exposed waste as it is landfilled. Aggregates are used in the maintenance of perimeter and haul roads around the landfill, as well as in the public drop-off area.

The purpose of this report is to seek Board approval to award a contract to Salish Environmental Group Inc. (Salish) for the supply and delivery of cover and aggregate material to the Sechelt Landfill for a value not to exceed \$1,230,000.

DISCUSSION

Request for Proposal Analysis

In June 2023, Request for Proposal (RFP) 2335203 was issued to secure a contractor for the supply and delivery of cover and aggregate material to the Sechelt Landfill on an as and when needed basis. One compliant bid was received.

The evaluation team of three (3) was led by the Sunshine Coast Regional District (SCRD) Purchasing and Risk Management Division. The proposal was reviewed and scored based on

the evaluation criteria included in the RFP. Based on the evaluation committee review, staff recommend awarding the contract to Salish Environmental Group Inc., in the amount up to \$1,230,000 as their proposal met all requirements.

The proposed contract term is five (5) years with the option to extend up to one (1) additional two-year term.

Financial Implications

This contract extension exceeds the current budget for this service in 2024 by \$38,010. The existing contract is funded through tipping fee revenue; however, current tipping fee revenue is trending slightly below budget as of September 30, 2023. The Q3 Corporate Financial Variance Report presented at the October 19 Finance Committee meeting noted an unfavourable variance of \$21,610, or 99% of budget.

Therefore, it is recommended that the contract increase, and future budget shortfalls be funded through taxation to maintain financial sustainability within the service. Tipping fee revenue is assessed annually through the budget process and any future increases to budgeted tipping fee revenue will result in an offsetting decrease to taxation, all other things being equal.

Staff recommend awarding the contract for the supply and delivery of cover and aggregate material for the Sechelt Landfill to Salish Environmental Group Inc. for an amount not to exceed \$1,230,000.
